We welcome you with love to your new and exciting role in the Al-Anon/Alateen family. As a Group Representative, you will see how Al-Anon/Alateen works and how service exposes you to a new level of personal growth and fellowship. GRs are a most important link in the Al-Anon/Alateen chain of service. You are the one who keeps your group in the information loop, bringing them timely notice of upcoming events and answers to any group problems. You are your group's voice as you cast your vote on matters affecting the business of Al-Anon/Alateen at Virginia Area Assemblies (Spring and Fall).

REQUIREMENTS: Any Al-Anon or Alateen member who is willing to represent the group at the district and area assembly, and who is not also a member of AA, is eligible to serve as GR. A GR should have a basic knowledge of Al-Anon and Alateen Traditions and Concepts of Service and how they work. (Institution groups that meet at hospitals, treatment centers, correctional and other residential facilities have transient memberships; there are no GRs.) In accordance with Tradition Eight, an Al-Anon/Alateen member who is gainfully employed in an Al-Anon/Alateen service can not serve as a volunteer in a policy-making position, such as Group Representative.

TERM: GRs are elected by their group for a three year term. No member may be GR of more than one group at a time.

REMINDERS: You are not "in charge" of your group and you are not alone. The Second Tradition tells us, "Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern." You don't have to have all the answers but you can help the group look at the Traditions, the Concepts and the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual for guidance. http://www.tidewaterasc.org/

Structure of Al-Anon / Alateen (See pp. 59-61 and p. 148 of the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual)

Each Al-Anon/Alateen Family Group elects a Group Representative. There is one District Representative (DR) in each district, which is a geographical segment containing a number of groups, located relatively close to one another. DRs are elected from past or current GRs.

An Area is made up of all the districts in a state or province. All the GRs and DRs in the Virginia Area attend Assemblies in the Spring and Fall (GR expenses are paid by the GR's home group.) Every three years, Assembly Officers (Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, etc.) are elected and special services Coordinators (such as Alateen, Archives, and Public Outreach) are appointed. A World Service Delegate is also elected every three years. This individual will represent his/her Area at the World Service Conference.

- Attends district meetings and area assemblies.
- Keeps members informed about information from the Area Delegate and the World Service Conference.
- Encourages members to subscribe to and submit articles for The Forum, Al-Anon/Alateen's monthly magazine.
- Suggests participation in Public Outreach (Public Information [PI], Cooperating with the Professional Community [CPC] and Institutions) and Alateen service projects.
- Informs members of the need to become Alateen Sponsors.
- Asks the Alternate GR to attend district meetings and assemblies.
- Assists the Alternate GR in serving as the Area Information Service Representative (ISR).
- Keeps the Alternate GR informed to insure the group is represented if unable to attend district and area assembly meetings.
- Explains the need for self-support at the group, district, area and world service levels.
- Consults with a Service Sponsor or trusted servants.
- Uses Alateen OR Al-Anon Registration / Group Records Change Form to keep the group mailing address up to date; opens and shares mail from the World Service Office
